1. Introduction

2. Sport Premium funding

Sport Premium is funding that is jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. PE & sport premium funding for schools is allocated for each financial year
