## Sport Premium Funding Report 2018-2019

### 1. Introduction

The learning and teaching of Physical Education across **HERA Primary Academy Trust** aims to develop children's knowledge of a healthy body together with how physical activity contributes to a balanced healthy lifestyle. PE provides opportunities for children to develop intellectually, socially, emotionally and physically through a range of team, group and individual experiences and opportunities.

### 2. Sport Premium funding

Sport Premium is funding that is jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. PE & sport premium funding for schools is allocated for each financial year

Our estimated PE and Sports Premium Funding for the academic year 2018-2019 is £19,240.

## 5. Meeting national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety

In February 2018, a letter was sent out to Year 6 parents asking if their child could:

- Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres.
- Use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke]
- Perform safe self-rescue in a pool

Out of 53 letters sent, 20 responses were received.

Out of the 20 responses received, the data is as follows:

Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres?	75%
Use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke]?	60%
Perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations?	70%

Currently, assuming those children who have not responded have not reached curriculum expectations, the cohort swimming data is as follows:

What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres?	29%
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke]?	23%
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations?	27%
Schools can choose to use the Primary PE and Sport Premium to provide additional provision for swimming but this must be for activity <b>over and above</b> the national curriculum requirements. Have you used it in this way?	No

We will endeavour to send all children who have been identified as not being able to swim 25 metres as well as those who have not responded for an initial assessment. Following the initial assessment, we will set up a swimming booster group for the remaining children identified as not being able to swim 25 metres.
