
Blending- look at a word and break up into each sound.

Segmenting- say word, break up into each sound and then write.



Phoneme- What sound can be heard.

Grapheme- What the sound looks like when written down.



Digraph- 2 letters that make 1 sound (th, ch, ai, ee, ow)

Trigraph- 3 letters that make 1 sound (igh, air, ear, ure)

What is phonics Screening?

All Year 1 children across the country will take part in a phonics screening check.

This will take place during the week beginning 6th June 2022 this year.



The Phonics Screening Check is designed to confirm whether individual children have learnt sufficient phonic decoding and blending skills to an appropriate standard.




The Phonics Screening check consists of 40 words covering phase 2-5.

The list of words are a combination of 20 real words and 20 pseudo words (nonsense or Alien words).



Pesudo words are included because they are new to all pupils; they do not favour children with good vocabulary knowledge or visual memory of words

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


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

All children are different therefore there is no time limit and each child will complete the task at their own pace.



Reporting to Parents

Any children who do not achieve the expected standard will retake the check in Year 2.
